On a beautiful Saturday morning in June, our school director, Jean Amorce (aka Fan Fan—pictured at left and right), and a few of our staff went to the Williamson campus to prepare for a fun field day the next week to celebrate the end of the school year. Fan Fan was optimistic that we would be able to move classes back to this campus following a period of peace in the area. However, this peace was shattered when gangsters from the nearby mountain villages kidnapped and murdered Fan Fan, Daniel (security guard) and Lano (groundskeeper). This senseless evil devastated


their families and left the school and community reeling. Fan Fan, especially, was known for his compassion, honesty, dedication to education, and love for the Lord. He left behind a wife and young daughter.

Daniel (at left with his daughter) and Lano also left family without a husband and father. We are still raising funds to continue to help these families in the aftermath of the tragedy and appreciate your support and prayers for them!

After hearing from many of the parents of our students, who pleaded for school to open in the fall, we found a building to rent in a safer location, appointed one of the teachers as principal, and
